

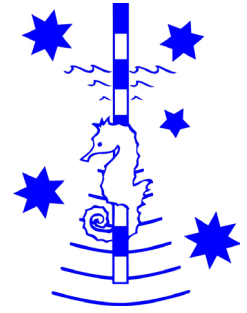

## **AHS AWARDS SCHEME 2005 – CALL FOR NOMINATIONS**

1. Following the successful introduction of the AHS Awards Scheme, with very worthy recipients over the last couple of years, it is now time to consider nominations for those who have contributed to our industry in 2005. In particular, I encourage members to become a little more adventurous and consider appropriate nominations in the corporate or even literary categories. As you will be aware, it is a right of membership that only AHS members can endorse nominations.
2. The policy, guidelines and selection process are detailed at Reference B, which is available on the AHS website (<http://www.ahs.asn.au/>). A nomination form is also attached to this letter. While nominations are open year round, closing for this year's awards will be Tuesday 30 November 2005, with awardees in the General Category announced mid-Dec 2005 and the Education Award mid-Jan 2006.
3. As a reminder, the Society's charter and constitution has, since inception, been to promote hydrography and related sciences. The AHS is by definition a learned organisation with a membership that now covers a broad spectrum of all those involved or having an expressed interest in hydrography and related sciences. As such, the consensus of the membership is that there is probably no better group involved with hydrographic pursuits to better judge all of the various contributions across the industry.
