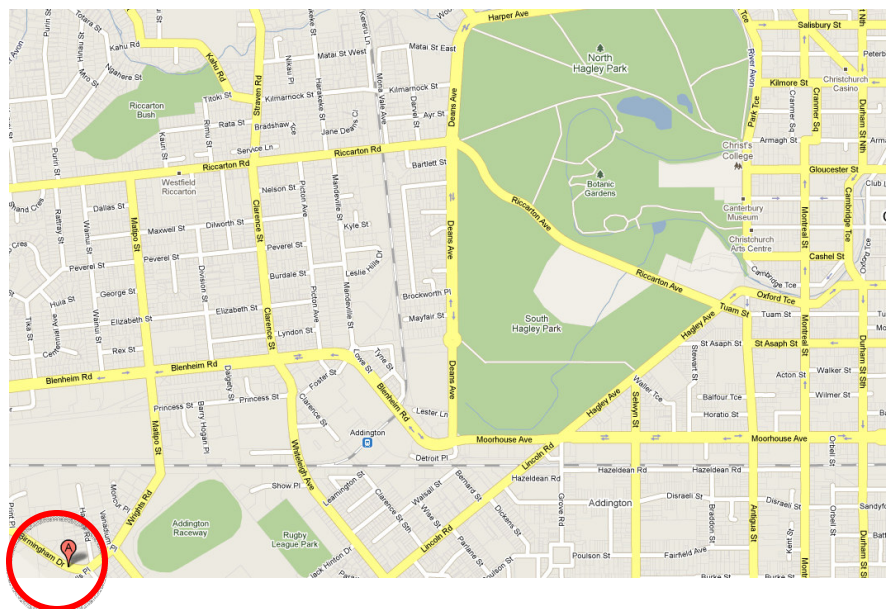
The seminar precedes the NZ Branch Society AGM which will be held at the end of the afternoon sessions.

Call for Presentations – “Hydrographic Services – An Essential Element for Maritime Trade and Tourism”

This year's theme of 'Maritime Trade and Tourism' provides an innovative opportunity for presenters. This topic is clearly dependant on positioning technology and mapping. Tourism is a major reason for improved nautical charting, and for the new charting of wilderness areas (such as Antarctica). Large cruise ships or large container ships can be accommodated at many ports large and small, limited only by the hydrography of a particular port. The marine environment attracts tourists, and special areas of the marine domain are cultivated for this purpose. The science of hydrography is involved in the necessary spatial planning, and resource management for many offshore activities.

The audience will be keen to hear about interesting or topical hydrographic developments within the region. Of particular interest will be those projects relating to the maintenance and development of trade or tourism.

All we require now is a short abstract and at the Seminar just present a PowerPoint presentation for 15 minutes followed by 5 minutes for questions.

There has been a lot of activity here recently and topics such as the following are suitable:

- Manufacturers (of hydrographic equipment)
- Ports and marine developments
- Contractors (for hydrographic surveys, charting etc.)
- University
- Marine Environment (Ministry Economic Development; MOE; offshore regulation)
- LINZ (Charting programme; hydro survey programme; Oceans 20/20)
